Four arrested as police seize large amount of drugs and cash

MORE than 140kg of drugs were seized and four men arrested – including Campsie men aged 29 and 66 – as police raided properties in Lilyfield and Campsie last

Organised Crime Squad detectives and specialist police from the Tactical Op-2kg of methylamphetamine

('ice') and arrested three men when at a Lilyfield property about 4.45pm on April 16.

All three were charged with offences relating to commercial drug supply and police believe they have smashed a major drug ring.

The 66-vear-old was arrested a short time later, and was also charged with commercial drug supply and criminal group offences. All

After the arrests, police executed search warrants at seven properties through-out Sydney, including three in Campsie, one in Canter-bury, one in Beaumont Hills, one in Riverwood and another in Croydon Park.

At one of the Campsie addresses, a storage facility on Perry St. police allege they found ephedrine, methylamphetamine and cocaine.

mont Hills, police seized \$460,000 in cash as well as numerous documents and electronic items. Cash, mobile phones and documents were also seized from a number of the other properties.
